This is a self-supporting congregation, so when the plate is passed in the middle of the service, please be generous. Today's collection will support our ministries to the community.

At the communion, God welcomes all to the heavenly banquet. The Episcopal Church offers the sacraments to anyone baptized in any denomination who, through prayer and thoughtful consideration, desires them. Please come to the communion rail to receive the bread whether you are an Episcopalian or not, or to receive a blessing.

When coming to the rail for communion, please kneel or stand at the rail from right to left until the rail is full. You may receive the wafer, receive the wine after consuming the wafer (no indicting) or may ask for a blessing. Please let the priest know if you need gluten free.

The priest, Debbie, is available after the service to answer any questions you might have. Please let her know your thoughts about today's service.

The First Lesson

Isaiah 43:16-21

Thus says the Lord, who makes a way in the sea, a path in the mighty waters, who brings out chariot and horse, army and warrior; they lie down, they cannot rise, they are extinguished, quenched like a wick: Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. The wild animals will honor me, the jackals and the ostriches; for I give water in the wilderness, rivers in the desert, to give drink to my chosen people, the people whom I formed for myself so that they might declare my praise.

The Second Lesson

Philippians 3:4b-14

If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, a member of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless. Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ. More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God based on faith. I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.

Next Sunday



Next Sunday is Palm Sunday, the first day of Holy Week. During this service, we receive blessed palms and then re-enact the Palm Sunday procession when Jesus entered Jerusalem the final time. This event is depicted in the Gospels as a fulfillment of many prophecies and is juxtaposed to the triumphal entry of the governor of Judea, Pontius Pilate. We will process outside near the beginning of the service singing "All glory, laud, and honor."

The mood of the service quickly changes after we return to the building as we hear the Passion narrative read. (There is a signup in the Lobby for those who wish to read a part). As we gather at the table for communion we are as one body who enter into these holy mysteries together.

Ongoing Weekly Events for All

Each week, there are four different groups that meet regularly where everyone is invited to be a participant.

Every Tuesday at 7:00 pm, the **Knitting Group** gathers in the Common Room at Grace Church. The items made are then donated to various organizations that support children in Salem and beyond. 
